Rotary International-Elect K.R. “Ravi” Ravindran is CEO and founder of Printcare PLC, a publicly listed printing, packaging, and media solutions company. It is arguably to world’s largest supplier of tea bag packaging, catering to nearly every major tea brand, with manufacturing facilities in Sri Lanka and India. He also serves on the board of several other companies in Sri Lanka and India and charitable trusts, including the MJF (Dilmar) Charitable Foundation. He is the founding president of the Rotary-sponsored Sri Lanka Anti Narcotics Association. During Sri Lanka’s civil war, Ravi was involved in the business community efforts to find peaceful solutions to the conflict and was a featured speaker at the United Nations-sponsored peace conference in New York for the Sri Lankan diaspora in 2002.

A third generation Rotarian and a member himself at the age of 21, Ravi has served on the Rotary International Board of Directors and The Rotary Foundation Board of Trustees and as RI Treasurer.

As his county’s national PolioPlus, Ravi headed a joint task force of the Sri Lankan government, UNICEF, and Rotary and worked closely with UNICEF to successfully negotiate a ceasefire with the northern militants during National Immunization Days. Aided by Rotary’s efforts, Sri Lanka reported it’s last case of polio in 1994.

He also chaired the Schools Reawakening project in which D3220 raised more than \$12m to rebuild over 20 tsunami-devastated schools to benefit 14,000 children. Ravi continues to play a role in his club’s project’s to build a cancer prevention and early detection centre. Once completed, it will be the only dedicated national facility in Sri Lanka to offer comprehensive screening and early detection services

Frankston North Rotary are actively involved in the Frankston North community on a number of projects. These projects range from participation in breakfast programs, Men's Shed, and providing input to educational programs involving various aspects of literacy and numeracy.

A specific project that Frankston North Rotary has been running for over three years now is the **"Computers for Communities Program"** a program that seeks to facilitate Data Centre refresh initiatives in the Melbourne CBD with the corresponding need of the local Frankston North communities to equip projects using computers, where due to a lack of funding, would otherwise be delayed or not go ahead. Below is a review of work carried out in collaboration with Monterey Secondary College.

Cogmed – "working memory training" - has been available to schools around the world since 2003 and in Australia since 2011. There are hundreds of schools in Australia who have implemented Cogmed and seen improvements in working memory attention and learning.

**Monterey SC "RESET" Project Team**

The RESET (Re-Engaging Students in Education and Training) team at Monterey SC is led by Principle Stuart Jones and staffed by Lucy, Anne and Brendan. The team also enjoy participation from a Psychologist. This is the first year the project has been run and the team are already seeing the benefits of the program. Frankston North Rotary provided 10 PCs for this initiative and the Cogmed Application was installed in them. The RESET project has an environment specifically addressing these student needs separate from but included in the Monterey SC Campus.

The picture on the right is of one area within the new Senior Student Study Hall – this environment provides opportunities for researching assignments individually and collectively. The environment is equipped with desks, leisure furniture and an area that allows online internetworking capability for the various assignments the students undertake within the VCE program. The students are responsible for the environment and the facility serves to encourage students to take responsibility for their learning outcomes. FNR provided 10 PCs.

Finally Monterey SC offer a Digital Media program within a new department and FNR are pleased to have been in a position to provide 10 PCs for this program in the Digital Media environment.


