

DG Paul began with a video showing him as a surf lifesaver promoting the District Conference in Cape Schanck on 24-26 February, to the accompaniment of a modified Banjo Pattison poem. He spoke of the rare opportunity of attending a Rotary International Convention in Melbourne on 25-26 May, preceded by the Malaria Congress 2 days earlier.

He explained the Rotary theme of Diversity, Equity and Inclusion.

- by diversity, we mean the presence of a people from all backgrounds, cultures, experiences, and identities
- by equity, we mean the striving for the fair treatment of, opportunities for, and the advancement of all Rotary participants
- by **inclusion**, we mean the ability to create experiences and foster environments in which all people feel welcome, respected, and valued
