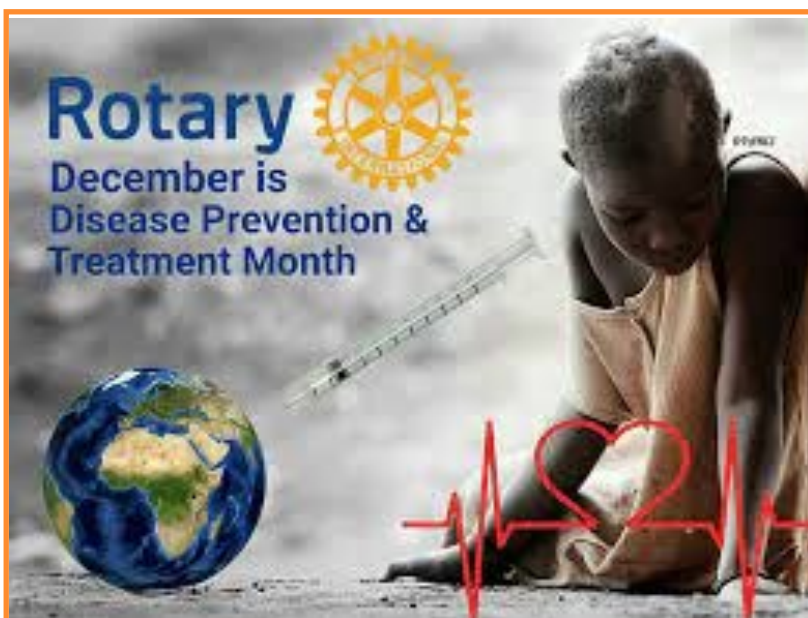

Guest Speaker: **Chris Rich - PARC**



Chris is the Sales Manager of the Peninsula Aquatic Recreation Centre (PARC) in Frankston. PARC has been operating for 8 years and is managed by Peninsula Leisure, along with the Pines Aquatic Centre in Frankston North, and is owned by Frankston City Council. It was recently awarded Facility of the Year in the Aquatic Recreation Victoria and was awarded Health Club of the Year for 2021.

There are 300 staff employed by Peninsula Leisure and facilities include a 50m pool, Waterslides and Childrens aquatic playground, Warm water pool, Spa & Sauna, Café, Health Club, Group Exercise studios and Creche.

The is Casual entry to the facility or Membership options. Among the services provided are 180+ fitness classes, including Yoga, Pilates, Tai chi and meditation to high intensity and aerobic classes, such as Body pumps, Zumba and older adult classes. Water based classes such as Aqua fit, Deep water running and Warm water workouts. There are also outdoor classes such as PARC Fit Run, and PARC Fit Outdoor. There are Personal Training classes for 1-on-1 and Small Group Training with up to 5 participants. Another service is Swimming lessons from 6 months to Adult. There is Specialist care Lifecare on site (physio and Exercise physiologists).

ROTARY TAKES ACTION ON FLOOD RELIEF

There is now a major mosquito danger within flood impacted communities. In order to provide some relief to affected communities, RAWCS has acquired thousands of mosquito repellent candles.

RAWCS has taken the initiative and will coordinate immediate distribution of mosquito repellent candles to various Rotary clubs in the flood impact locations. The candles will then be distributed by local Rotary Clubs directly to those most in need. Candles have now landed in Shepparton (VIC), Lismore (NSW), Parkes (NSW) and Gympie (QLD) for distribution.

Rotary Australia World Community Service Ltd (RAWCS) is appealing for funds to assist communities impacted by the ongoing flood crisis. Donations can be directed to the RAWCS national flood appeal or to specific appeals covering various flooded regions.

Funds donated to the appeals are being used in the following ways:-

- Backing the projects and immediate assistance programs undertaken by local Rotarians in the flood zones.
- Funding cash vouchers to help with the immediate needs of flood victims as well as supporting local businesses when the vouchers are spent in the impacted towns.
- Assisting with temporary housing initiatives.
- Provision of new clothing and new bed linen.

Distribution of free mosquito repellent candles to help protect families from diseases carried by swarming mosquitos in the flood aftermath. The candles repel mosquitos for sixty hours, are odorless and normally retail for \$16 each.

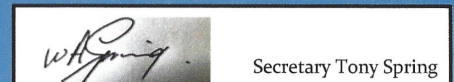
