



<u>Guest Speakers</u>: David and Karen Shimshon "Our newest Rotarian"



David was born in Tel Aviv, Israel and after completing his secondary education, he was obliged to join the Army under Israel's Compulsory National Service requirement. The males are required to serve for 3 years and females for 2 years immediately after completing their secondary education. After completing his 3 years as a soldier, he re-signed with the Army for another 3 years which allowed him to study for an Electrical Engineering degree, majoring in Laser Optics at the government's expense.

He then worked in the Laser industry for a leading laser technology company that produced and exported laser products around the world. He travelled round the world instructing clients on the operation and service of his company's leading technology medical laser products.

Among his travels, he visited Australia several times and came to like the country.

Meanwhile, Karen was born in Johannesburg, South Africa during the Apartheid years. Following the Sharpville Massacre in 1960, which started off as a peaceful demonstration against Apartheid but during which 250 people were either killed or wounded, her father decided to leave South Africa for the UK. They only lived there for a short time before Karen developed a health problem caused by the UK polluted climate. The family then moved to Majorca for 2 years where the climate was good but the infrastructure was poor, so it was back to South Africa where she completed her education and studied Nursing. This was a poorly paid profession so she gave it up to become a Bookmaker and ran a Tattersalls agency. While this was satisfying, the travel bug hit and she went back to the UK for 2 years, working in various offices before returning to South Africa to work in a family-owned Scrap Metal business.

As a Zionist Karen decided to participate in a Volunteer program in Israel in the Navy as a painter, gar-

dener and tuck shop assistant, allowing soldiers additional time off. She also too an intensive language course in Hebrew. Upon completion of this course, she got a full time job in a laser company, where she met David who was the Technical Support Manager, and the rest is history.

They were married in Israel in 1998 but were disillusioned by the political situation there and looked for opportunities to leave and raise their son in a more politically stable country. David's company had a laser dental client in Australia and they were able to arrange employment there.

They lived in the Doncaster and Templestowe area, where there is an active and proud Jewish community. Both David and their son have both sat on the Board of Management and Karen was the Centre Administration Officer. They lived there for over 15 years before retiring to Mornington in 2017.
