We are now seeing returned personnel from the Afghan conflict who will no doubt have their own unique issues, given the type of conflict that we were involved in over there, and the fact that the whole thing is unresolved.

Once again, well done Cookie and Crew, we look forward to your ANZAC Day commemoration in 2024!







Guest Speakers: John Pilkington and Liz Brown "Veteran Welfare"

Chairman Ron opened the segment by playing the song by Redgum "I was only 19". The song presents a soldier's experience of war and reflects on Australia's attitude to involvement in the Vietnam conflict. The song helped Australians to better appreciate the plight of soldiers that returned from the conflict and its lyrics were inscribed on the Australian Vietnam Forces National Memorial in 1992.

He then introduced John and Liz. John is a Vietnam Veteran who served in the Engineer Corps, and since 1997, became a Pension and Welfare advocate at Noble Park RSL He is the Secretary of the Vietnam Veterans Noble Park Sub-Branch and is a life member.

Liz is also a Pension and Welfare advocate at Noble Park RSL since 2008, a year after

her first husband (also a veteran) died. She had skills to offer and wanted to thank the Noble Park Vietnam Veterans for their support in the years before his death. She was on the Victorian Veterans Council for six years. After her family left home, Liz put herself through a Law degree. She is on the committee of the Noble Park RSL.

There have been several different Acts under the umbrella of the Department of Veterans Affairs (DVA) since the Vietnam War. They include the Veteran

Entitlements Act and The Defence Rehabilitation & Compensation Act and the current one is the Military Rehabilitation & Competition Act (MRCA).

And with the advent of each new Act, the treatment of Veterans seems to get worse. With the passing away of the WW2 Veterans, DVA reduced their staff and lost a lot of corporate knowledge. Then they introduced on-line claims, which led to claims being made en masse by the younger, computer savvy Iraq and Afghanistan Veterans, leaving DVA overloaded with claims and a lack of staff with corporate knowledge to process them.

This led to a massive re-think on how we help Veterans today. This has led to less face-to-face contact for the Vietnam Veterans and most of the communication with DVA is on-line, which is difficult for Vietnam Veterans.

Pension & Welfare officers assist with submitting claims, getting Service and Medical records, doctor and specialists reports, getting accessing X-ray, scans, MRI's and any reports that can help with their claims. Listening to the Veterans is their major tool today. They also assist with Veteran's families, aids and appliances, appointments with therapists, doctors, physiotherapists and hospitals, emergency services and drug abuse issues.

Another difficulty is the DVA public service attitude and the role of advocate was now widened to include acting as a mediator between the Veteran, DVA and other like organisations. Our Vietnam Veterans deserve better.
