



Interact at McClelland College

My name is Andrew Hemsley and I am the current VCE Leader and Acting Assistant Principal at McClelland College. This year, I endeavoured to establish the school's first Interact Club as a way of broadening the horizons of students during their final years of schooling. I firmly believe that students who are empathetic towards others and who have compassion in their hearts are much more likely to be successful academically, as well as to have higher levels of resilience throughout their lives.

McClelland will be the third Interact Club that I have founded (a record I am sure), after establishing Clubs at both Doncaster Secondary College and McKinnon Secondary College, the last of which was the largest Interact Club in Australia with over 200 students registered.

This year at McClelland, we have already held a World's Greatest Shave Event for the Leukaemia Foundation which raised over \$2000. Our next project is a cook off to raise money for a school in Afghanistan which we will be collaborating with Hamida Lufti of the Afghan community on achieving. We will

also be holding a sleep in at the school early in Term Three in order to raise money for State School Relief, which provides uniform and textbooks for families in need. Hopefully we can squeeze in one more project before our Year 12 students head off to study for their end of year exams!

We thank the Rotary Club of Frankston North for their ongoing support, and look forward to a positive, collaborative relationship well into the future! Thank you!

HOW ROTARY HELPED BEAT THE RUSSIANS

When Baltic nation Lithuania was fighting for its freedom in the early 1990s it had big problems rejoining international organisations such as Rotary.

But it got help from Australian Rotarians who intervened in an international dispute with Moscow, which was trying to stop countries like Lithuania from going their own way.

More than 30 years after Lithuania won independence, the small nation's Rotary leaders are here in Melbourne to give thanks to local members who helped out.

At the weekend they met up at the Rotary International Convention and also were hosted at the Lithuanian community centre in North Melbourne by local Rotarian Balys Stankunavicius.

In 1990, Mr Stankunavicius was asked by then Lithuanian Prime Minister Kazimiera Prunskiene to lobby for her country to rejoin Rotary after the Russian occupiers had banned it for 50 years.

Mr Stankunavicius said that global Rotary leaders, under pressure from the then USSR, were initially reluctant to give the green light to Lithuania.

"It was outrageous," he said. "I spoke to my Rotary mates in Melbourne about what was going on and they were furious.

"Australian District Governor Greg Ross and Toorak Rotary president Les Goldman led a vigorous campaign."

It paid off – in 1992 Rotary returned to Lithuania for the first time since World War II.

Rotary Lithuania District Governor Jurgita Turuliene said Mr Ross and Mr Stankunavicius had played a key role.

"So it's amazing to be here in Melbourne to thank them," she said.
