Vocational - Guest Speaker Jeff Rogut, CEO Business Collective

Jeff is the CEO of the new Frankston Business Collective, which he established and launched in July 2022. Prior to this he was CEO of the Australasian Convenience Store Association for 10 years.

Jeff has a long history in retail across a number of companies in management roles including buying, merchandising, general management and small business ownership. He has been a franchisee as well as franchisor. His career has taken him to many countries across the world and instilled an appreciation of what a great country we live in.

Jeff is married, has two sons and 3 young grandchildren who are his inspiration.

The Business Collective, a Frankston Council initiative, has been established to support the business community of Frankston. A board of seven has been appointed and it currently has 169 members which include local government, business entrepreneurs, and non-profit organisations.

The three pillars of the organisation are Advocacy, Connection, and Education. Their values include accountability, collaboration, integrity and Service.

The benefits for members are networking, forming new business contacts and promotion of their business through direct contact and social media, maintaining currency with the business world, and advocacy in relation to issues that affect business on all levels such as wellbeing, safety and education, and education

Business Awards recently introduced to recognise business initiatives and emerging industries attracted 47 entries.

The business Collection has also formed a connection with students at a local secondary school linking **education** to real life opportunities, such as support and guidance that young people need to get more out of life, work, and study.

Geoff invited Rotary to attend a Business Collective meeting and to consider applying for membership. Geoff believes that such a relationship would be beneficial to both parties.

The difficulty in finding local businesses and other agencies to support local young people to attend the annual RYLA (Rotary Youth Leadership Award) program was raised. Geoff believes there is the potential for the Business Collective to support this initiative.

In response to comments regarding the need to take a more entrepreneurial approach to the future development of Frankston, Geoff acknowledged that recently there has been a much more optimistic outlook to make Frankston a more desirable city to live and also an attraction for tourists.

Maree thanked Geoff for his informative presentation.
