



Last Saturday Judi attended MUNA (Model United Nations Assembly) at the Gustav Nossal High School in Berwick.

The guest speakers were Tracey Mackin (Principal, Nossal High School) and Chris Crewther, MP (MLA Mornington), who addressed the delegates on topics relating to Diversity, Equity and Inclusion and Humanitarian Issues. Twenty-six delegations representing UN-member states participated.

They debated four resolutions. Topics were:

- 1. The global environment and a meaningful response to natural disasters,
- 2. Restructure of the United Nations Security Council,
- 3. Protection of International Trade Route, and
- 4. Social Media Regulation.

Each resolution was debated for 75 mins.

Year 10, 11 and 12 students participated. It involves researching a particular nation and then debating other participants representing other nations. They learn debating skills, learn about other countries, and get an understanding of other points of view. Rotary financially supports the students to attend. It was an excellent demonstration of the potential for what the students can achieve. A day to remember.

Guest Speaker - <u>Jessie Harman</u> - Past RI Director (by video) "Top 10 Tips for Delivering an Exceptional Rotary Experience"



Tip 1: Take Time to Understand Member Expectations. There are common and unique member needs, and member needs and expectations may change. This requires pre-entry interviews, regular one-on-one discussions, surveys and mentor chats.

Tip 2: Ensure Members are Actively Engaged. Ensure members understand how they can engage and are able to engage. Encourage them to be actively engaged and involved.

Tip 3: Engage Members in Service which is Meaningful to them. Deliver an experience which meets individual needs and expectations, and is meaningful for individuals. We are all busy!

Tip 4: Design Member Focussed Processes. Ensure member processes are member friendly, smooth and timely. How we pay our dues. Is it easy for members? Could we pay them monthly?

Tip 5: Ensure Physical Elements reinforce Service Quality. Venue, apparel, brochures, website, signs, etc. Do they make you proud?

Tip 6: Address Problems Quickly. Listen to member complaints, Make amends when things go wrong. Have a system of addressing complaints that members understand. People are different and react differently to issues.

Tip 7: Pricing and Value: Ensure 'price' represents perceived value; financial and non-financial. Help members understand the value of membership.

Tip 8: Measure Satisfaction Regularly. Formal and informal methods: surveys, club assemblies, discussions.

Tip 9:Coordinate Communications. Communications must be consistent and unified.

Tip 10: Keep Communication Real. Don't mislead or overstate. Use the Brand. Ensure expectations match member experience.
