

Rotary A child dies from malaria nearly every minute one is is not acceptable Against Malaria Against Mal

March Against Malaria

Tony Spring led a discussion about how we could organize an event to raise funds for the March Against Malaria.

Rotarians Against Malaria (RAM) is a volunteer-run activity, falling under the auspices of Rotary Australia World Community Service Ltd (RAWCS), working to eliminate Malaria.

Since the disruption of COVID-19 a child under 5 now dies of Malaria every minute; Malaria deaths and cases increased globally by 12% and 6% respectively, and testing has fallen by 4%.

These are horrifying statistics, especially as Malaria is treatable and cura-

ble. Further, as Malaria impacts mostly poorer women and children, it perpetu-

ates a vicious cycle of poverty in the developing world through maternal mortality, neonatal and child deaths, school absenteeism, burden of treatment costs and decreased economic productivity.

In the Western Pacific Rim region (Papua New Guinea, Solomon Islands, Vanuatu and Timor-Leste) which is the focus of RAM, Malaria cases and deaths are up 19% and 23% respectively since the beginning of COVID-19.

We need to get our Malaria elimination goal back on track, and help children, pregnant women and the elderly most at risk.

The **March Against Malaria (MAM)** is a major initiative to reverse this alarming trend of increasing deaths and cases since the good work of RAM was disrupted by COVID-19.

Rotarians have been asked to organize fundraising events under the banner of MAM, supported by Rotary Australian Districts, RAWCS and RAM.

Frankston North Rotary has committed to organize an event in the March Against Malaria, and discussed various ideas for such an event. A subcommittee, under the leadership of Simon Gillham, will take those ideas and develop them into a suitable event. The sub-committee will meet at Simon and Maureen's home on Tuesday, 21st November to develop plans for our Mach Against Malaria event.
